SECOND CLASS NEWS



This autumn, 2nd Class have been busy learning and creating! In Maths, the children have been exploring place value and learning all about 2-D shapes. They even used their creativity to make some fantastic place value creations, showing off what they've learned in a fun and colourful way.

In English, the boys have been practising how to put words in alphabetical order and using question marks and commas correctly in their writing. Their reading and writing skills are really coming along beautifully. The 2nd Classes have also started cursive writing and are very proud of how neat our handwriting is becoming!



As part of their SESE work, the children have been learning all about autumn. They went on an autumn walk around the school grounds to spot the signs of autumn- from colourful leaves to shiny conkers. Everyone enjoyed being nature detectives for the day! In Gaeilge, we've been practising new phrases and songs about an fómhar and talking about the weather each day. In Art, they explored the colours of autumn leaves and made seasonal artwork to brighten up our classroom. During our Go Phone Free week, the boys brainstormed how they can spend less time on screens and more time playing, reading, and enjoying time with our families. 
THIRD CLASS NEWS



We've had a busy and exciting start to Third Class, working hard and learning losts of new things! We've tackled multiplication, explored the fascinating world of the Aztecs, and learned about Mexico. In poetry, we had fun experimenting with and making our own Cinquain and Acrostic poems.

In D.L.P., we've been practising our script handwriting and writing about ourselves, including sharing memories of our best holidays. We also created a pastel drawing of Naas Ball, which was a fun art project.

To get into the Hallowe'en spirit, we've been practising 'Oíche Shamhna', as Gaeilge, and making funny skeletons. We've stayed active by swimming and working on our running and throwing skills. We have also been setting up our Google Classroom accounts in the Computer Room, preparing for the year ahead!









FOURTH CLASS NEWS



The boys have been working hard in 4th class. In science they have learnt about the respiratory system and floating and sinking. They are also building a small boat that will float. In history, they have learnt about the The Great Flood in Australia. They also learned about the history of St. Corban's School and Edmund Rice. In geography, the children learned about Australia and their own local area, Naas.



In art, the boys have just completed lovely posters to encourage students to go shone free. In English, the boys wrote very good recounts on the infamous outlaw, Ned Kelly. They also learnt about Limericks in poetry. The boys recently enjoyed the local garda visiting them to discuss Halloween safety.









FIFTH CLASS NEWS



This term, 5th Class learned all about the Great Famine in History. The boys took part in a Famine Walk and visited a former famine workhouse, right on our doorstep, and created some wonderful Famine-inspired art pieces. They also explored famine around the world, comparing past and present situations. In Geography and History, they learned about Native American life and made beautiful dream catchers in Art to complement their studies.

In Science, the boys carried out experiments on starch, testing different foods to see which contained it. In P.E., they focused on athletics, working on running, jumping, and throwing skills.



The fifth classess explored new strategies in Maths and succeeded in extending their new mathematical skills into other areas such as art, when they used lines and angles to create perspective paintings. In Gaeilge, the boys enjoyed learning the theme 'Mé Féin', while in Music, they learned and performed the song, 'The Fields of Athenry'.

It's been a busy and creative term full of learning and fun.






CODING CLUB

We have sent home a Christmas Shoebox Appeal leaflet to every child. The digital leaflet and videos can be found online at www.teamhope.ie.


We'd encourage the boys to bring in their Christmas Shoeboxes by Friday




Spooktacular Hallowe'en Walk




PARENTS' ASSOCIATION

Since our return in September, they have been busy organising all of the following.






